

WHAT DO WE DO IN BRAZIL?

In Brazil, we maintain the **Fraternity Without Borders Orchestra Project**, which provides music education to young people from the suburbs. We help people who live on the streets through five **Fraternity on the Street** centers in four states in Brazil and in four cities in the United States. In the state of Mato Grosso do Sul, Brazil, such a support occurs through a partnership with **Clinic of the Soul**.

In Roraima, through **Brazil, a Welcoming Heart** project, we welcome migrant and refugee families from Venezuela, who cross the border into Brazil in search of a new life opportunity.

In partnership with Professor João Amorim Neto Research Institute, we support treatment for **children with microcephaly** in Campina Grande, in the state of PB, as well as in the state of MG, trough **Portraits of Hope** project. We also have **Butterflies' Garden** project, in the state of BA, which supports children with Epidermolysis Bullosa.



WHAT DO WE DO IN AFRICA?

In Sub-Saharan Africa, we are active in **Madagascar**, **Mozambique**, **Malawi**, and **Democratic Republic of Congo**. On the West Coast, in **Senegal**, and in Central America, in **Haiti**.

We open and maintain shelter centers where we offer **food**, **hygiene** and health care, educational and cultural activities, as well as vocational training.

We support the elderly with food and by building houses for them.

We drill artesian wells in African villages and once water is supplied, we carry out sustainable food planting, by training young farmers and involving children in environmental education activities.





REALITY IN MADAGASCAR

Province: Toliara

City: Ambovombe - South of the Island of Madagascar

When we arrived in Madagascar in February **2017**, we found families living in extreme poverty, suffering from **hunger and thirst.**

Without access to water, children only bathed when it rained. 30% of these children had moderate to severe malnutrition.

The families lived in very precarious houses, and the lack of hygiene and malnutrition caused diseases such as taeniasis, neurocysticercosis, chigoe flea, and other parasites or diseases.

Adults and children walk up to 6 km to get food, access water to bathe, brush their teeth and wash their clothes at our welcome centers..



THE GREAT FAMINE

More than 1.26 million people in the south of the island of Madagascar are facing serious food shortages.

Hunger is expected to **increase** as plantations are devastated by sandstorms and a historic drought.

FOOD AND NUTRITION DATA

- + **1,300** monthly appointments at the Medical Clinic in Peace Camp.
- + **1,400** monthly nutritional monitoring
- + 3,000 per year, children are part of the vaccination,
 vitamins, and medical follow-up program to avoid malnutrition
- + **500** yearly prenatal care.
- + **900** family planning appointments per year
- + **400** hospitalizations per year.
- + **30** people with mental health problems in continued care at Vila Toby
- + **10** children receiving neurological stimulation.

BEFORE THE CITY OF FRATERNITY

As we started the work in Madagascar, we have witnessed a harsh reality: small houses, where large families lived in.

Absence of minimum conditions of dignity to the local families, without access to water.





After that, the initiative of construction of the **City of Fraternity** was born.







CITY OF FRATERNITY

About one hundred families that previously lived in absolutely precarious little houses started to live in the City of the Fraternity. In n donated area with **45 thousand square meters**, currently, the project includes **105 houses**, workshops and sustainable cultivation.

The community is encouraged to accomplish its own capacity to conquer self-esteem and to experience values that cultivate peace.


105 HOUSES IN THE CITY OF FRATERNITY (INITIAL IMAGE)







WHAT HELP THE SUFFERING FAMILIES NEED

As the houses built with wood are not resisting the local weather conditions, all of them need reconstruction.

This year, the sandstorm started early in January. Usually, it occurs in September and October. The most recent storm lasted a whole week.

The objective is to rebuild 105 houses with the ecological bricks made in our workshop, as soon as possible.

A BETTER FUTURE

- The City of Fraternity has an ecological bricks workshop, and those bricks manufactured there enable the construction of more suitable houses to the local conditions than the woodenmade ones. Moreover, they work with modern equipment from Brasil.
- The reconstruction of the houses with the ecological bricks stimulates the sustainability actions in Madagascar

BRICK PRODUCTION WORKSHOP

Community training is provided for the production of clay bricks for the construction of toilets in the region, besides being a source of income.

We are revitalizing villages with skilled labor in brick production workshops in the region. In the ecological brick workshop, **04 workers** benefit from a social income. They produce **3000 bricks per month**, which are stored to be used later for the construction of houses.
